PEDESTRIAN PLAZA & HISTORIC U.S. CUSTOM HOUSE EXHIBITS

The U.S. / Mexico international border crossing at San Ysidro, one of the busiest in the world, underwent a major expansion and restoration process beginning in 2020. The Artefact team was asked to interpret the historic designation of the former International Building and the restoration of the U.S. Custom House — managed by General Services Administration (GSA.)

The bilingual exterior plaza exhibit consists of a ~65'W x 10'H graphic comprised of multiple panels, and a 12.5'W x 1.5'H interpretive reading rail to provide context for the wall image. The content focus recognizes the former International Building and the restoring of the historic U.S. Custom House.

The bilingual interior exhibit within the U.S. Custom House consists of a ~20'W x 8'H wall-mounted corner map graphic and eight 4'W x 3'H historical postcard images. The content focus centers on the history of the building and significance of land border stations along the southern border.
